Crossing Boundaries

At the Innovation Center, we're always looking for new ways to share our work and engage others in learning about leadership - and an online conference is our latest effort!

Earlier this month, Innovation Center Senior Director Dr. Carla Roach presented a workshop at an online conference hosted by PublicDecisions. The conference's theme was "Including the Excluded," and Dr. Roach's presentation discussed how collective leadership engages a full array of community stakeholders - including those whose voices aren't often heard.

The online forum for learning and discussion modeled the conference's theme. By hosting a virtual conference, PublicDecisions removed financial and logistical barriers that might have prevented some individuals from participating in the event.

Reflecting on the online conference experience, both as a presenter and as an attendee, Dr. Roach said that it "was a great place to meet people who share our interest in stakeholder engagement. After my presentation, I connected with participants on the other side of the country - and right down the street! PublicDecisions brought us together in an authentic and engaging way."

Dr. Roach's presentation on collective leadership highlighted ways to bring diverse stakeholders together at the community level. The "talk on collective leadership," Beth Offenbacher, President and Chief Learning Officer of PublicDecisions, said, "provided people both with practical insights and strategies for applying this approach in their own work and it opened the door to a broader conversation about leadership and change."

One of the reasons collective leadership is so unique - and so successful - is that it does not rely on traditional paradigms of leadership that center power in one or two people, usually adults. Instead, collective leadership asks all participants to share responsibility and together provide leadership to their community.
